
# Pat and Bap Update

# The Greatest Story Ever Told

This five-chapter book invites you into the drama of Jesus' life like never before. With gripping storytelling and raw honesty, Bear Grylls retells the gospel through the eyes of those who knew Jesus best— Myriam (his mother Mary ), Ta'om (Thomas), Shimon (Simon Peter), Yohanan (friend) & Myriam of Magdala (Mary Magdalene). # **How It Works**

The Big Church Read brings people together to read the same book at the same time. Across five sessions, you'll read one section each week, then watch a short videos from Bear Grylls and Andrew Ollerton (Bible Society). Each

video comes with discussion questions for personal reflection or group conversation.

The first video launches on 15 October, with a new video released each Wednesday for the next four weeks—five in total. All videos will remain available, so you can start or catch up at any time.
