Winter illness and HC

On the run up to Christmas we were advised by a local GP to be caution regarding the distribution of Holy Communion due to a spike in illnesses, which caused QA hospital to receive a larger than average intake of people needing hospitalization.

During the winter months and dark nights we may experience further widespread illness.

During this time clergy may choose to offer only Bread during communion like we experienced during Covid to help reduce local illness.

We may also give individuals the opportunity to instinct (Dip Bread) into the wine if they would rather, which can also reduce the spread of illness.

If you are someone who is vulnerable to illness and would like to discuss this further, please speak to a clergy person or a church warden. We can also arrange for people to receive Holy Communion at home if they would rather not venture to church. Let's do all we can to reduce sickness this winter.
